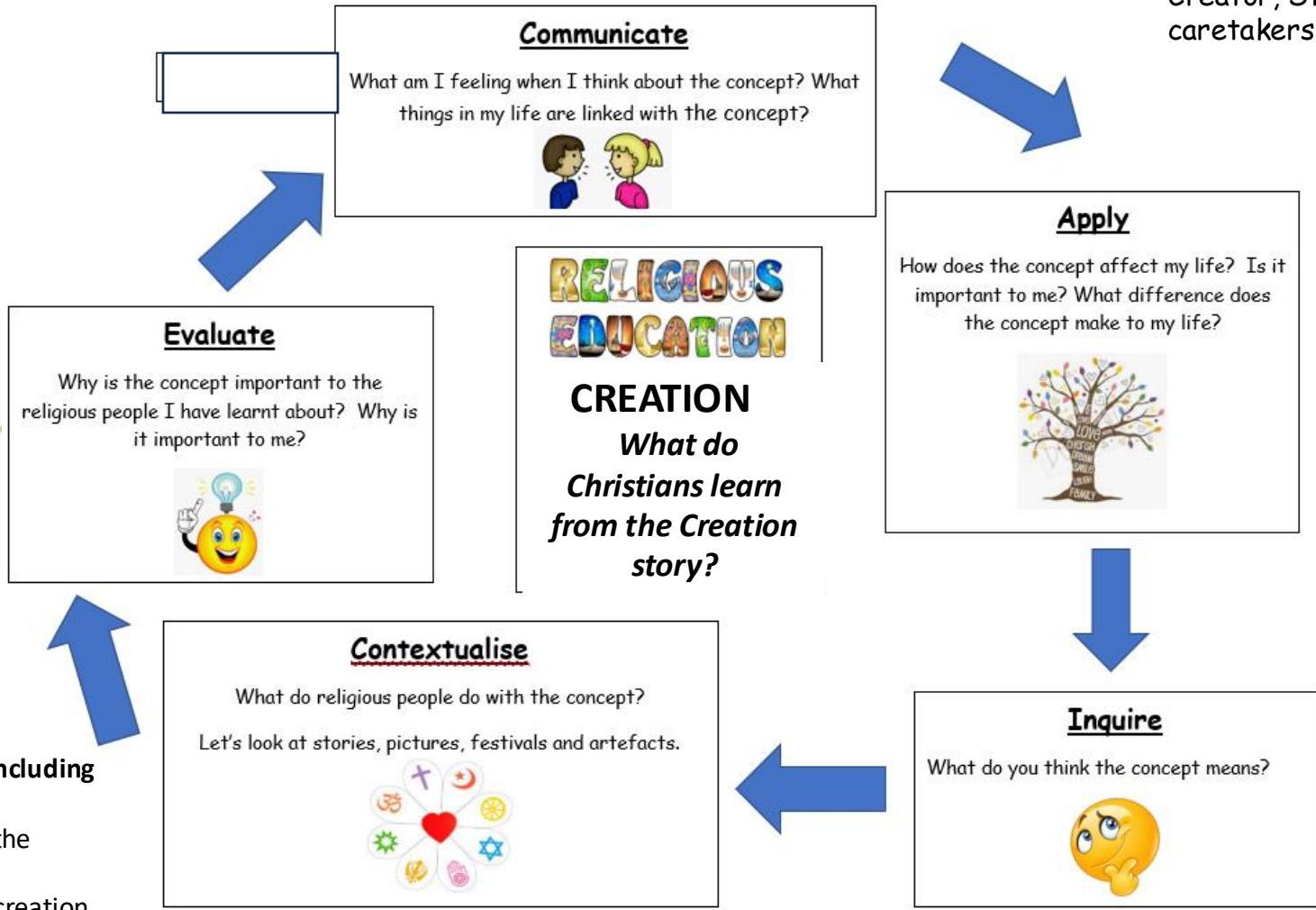
Why are nature and humans important and why should we look after the world and each other? What can we do to make the world 'very good'?

Sticky knowledge

- *God the Creator cares for the creation, including humans beings
- *Humans are 'stewards' or 'caretakers' of the world for God.
- *As human beings are part of God's good creation, they do best when they **listen to God**
- *The Bible shows that God wants to help people to be close to him — he keeps his relationship with them, gives them guidelines on good ways to live (such as the Ten Commandments) and offers forgiveness when they keep on falling short.



Communicate

What am I feeling when I think about the concept? What things in my life are linked with the concept?

Apply

How does the concept affect my life? Is it important to me? What difference does the concept make to my life?

Inquire

What do you think the concept means?

Contextualise

What do religious people do with the concept?
Let's look at stories, pictures, festivals and artefacts.

Why is the concept important to the religious people I have learnt about? Why is it important to me?
