

## Subject: Geography

Year 1 / 2

### Would you go down to the woods today?

#### Context:

The children will build upon their knowledge of the world and location of the UK and focus on their local area of Fareham. They will study and observe physical and human features of their environment.

#### National Curriculum:

*Human and physical geography*

Local area -human and physical features (and associate vocab)

*Geographical Field Work*

Use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of their school and its grounds and the key human and physical features of its surrounding environment.

#### Prior Knowledge:

In EYFS pupils learnt about some similarities and differences between the natural world around them and contrasting environments, drawing on their experiences and what has been read in class.

#### Sticky Knowledge:

- We live in Fareham, in England in the UK
- Our school is located in Fareham and called St Columba C of E Primary
- Human features are manmade, and physical features have always been part of the landscape and are not manmade.
- People live in different types of house: terraced, detached, semi-detached, flats and bungalows.
- St Columba Church is one of the buildings in Fareham.
- Aerial photos look down from the sky and can show roads, houses, green areas and other buildings like churches and shops.

#### Enquiry Questions:

- Where in the world do we live?
- Where is our school?
- What human and physical features can we find near us (on maps)?
- Can we identify human and physical features on our walk around our area?
- What types of houses do people live in?
- How busy is the traffic near our school?

#### Geographical Field Work:

Use aerial photos to identify human and physical features.

Use atlases and world maps to identify the UK and Fareham.

Local walk – observational skills to identify human and physical features.

Local walk – carry out simple traffic survey (field work) to answer enquiry question.
